What

This is a family camp sponsored by Upper Arlington Lutheran Church (UALC). The camp is designed as a special opportunity for family fellowship and a chance to enjoy more fully the deep community we share in Christ.

Where

Cedar Campus is a 50 acre resort located in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, 38 miles east of the Mackinac Bridge. InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, an organization for college students, owns the six miles of scenic Lake Huron shoreline. Many members of UALC have attended programs at Cedar Campus over the years, and the camp has hosted visits from our youth program, as well as our previous family camp weeks.

When

Camp goes from dinner on Saturday, July 28th, through breakfast on Friday, August 3rd. The trip from Columbus is almost 500 miles. Transportation to and from Cedar Campus is up to each family. You can find maps and directions on the UALC website at www.ualc.org/camps.

Who

This vacation opportunity is open to all families. We'll make every effort to accommodate everyone who would like to go, but dining facilities are limited to 155 people. If your family would like to bring a guest, please include him/her when you register. If you want to add guests after the registration deadline, we will put them on a waiting list. Although there may be an empty bed in your housing unit, there may not be an extra place at your table unless you register your guest. Should registration exceed camp capacity, a housing unit lottery will be done.

Accommodations

Tent & RV Sites

\$259 site

Cedar Campus offers a variety of scenic locations along the shoreline and in the woods. Electric hookup is provided, but no water or sewage. The bathhouse facility is nearby. No picnic tables are available. One family per site.

Taylor Lodge (13 families)

6 Small Rooms (up to 4 people)

\$412

7 Large Rooms (up to 6 people)

\$479

This is the main lodge where the dining hall and large meeting rooms are located. Rooms are within baby monitor range! Dormitory-style housing occupies the second floor. All lodge guests use men's and women's bathrooms located at one end of the corridor. Rooms are carpeted, and furnished with a dresser and single or bunked beds. Study carrels and alcoves adjacent to the rooms offer lounging space for use by guests.

Southwind Cabin (2 families)

Bedroom \$699

This facility is a 2-bedroom unit with a shared living area that includes a wood stove, sink, refrigerator, and microwave. Each bedroom sleeps six and has a full private bathroom.

Four Anchors (4 families)

Bedroom \$765

This is a condominium style cabin unit with four bedrooms (2 upstairs & 2 downstairs) each with a private bathroom. A shared leisure area contains tables, chairs, fireplace, dining area, kitchen and $\frac{3}{4}$ bath. Three bedrooms can comfortably sleep 4-5. One of the bedrooms can comfortably sleep 6-7.

Gloria Taylor (4 families)

Bedroom \$831

This is a condominium style cottage unit with 4 bedrooms with private bathrooms, all on one level. A common leisure area contains a fireplace, chairs, table, dining area, and $\frac{1}{2}$ bath. One bedroom has a king size bed. All others have 2 double beds. All rooms have space for roll-away beds or bunks and can comfortably sleep 5-7 people. This unit also has a washer and dryer.

Forbrich Cabin (1 family)

Bedroom \$842

This cabin features a wood stove, full kitchen and bathroom. It's two bedrooms sleep two people each. The living area also has a sofa sleeper.
