Jesus Washes Feet (John 13:1-17)

QUESTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION AND PERSONAL REFLECTION:

1. So many of Jesus' important moments seem to happen during meal times. What important conversations or moments have you experienced while breaking bread with others?
2. Share a time when Jesus served in your life as "Teacher."
3. Share a time when Jesus served in your life as "Lord."
4. The discipleship implications for Jesus' example in this passage are far-reaching. Jesus truly is our Teacher and Lord. He is victorious and full of all power and authority. Everything is in his hands. His exercise of that authority is to lower himself and sacrifice himself for the world. How does that translate to our daily lives? Consider that there is power in the unshakable identity given by God. Jesus has made it possible for us to be "his very own in the world." In that regular relationship with Jesus, we receive freedom and power to live in the cruciform shape of loving one another. Discuss some of the blessings to enjoy and the challenges to face that come with living in the way of Jesus.
