Jesus Says Come and See (John 1:35-51)

## QUESTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION AND PERSONAL REFLECTION:

1. In John 1:38 Jesus asks his first followers, "What do you want?" More literally: What are you seeking? If that question were addressed to you, how would you answer? Try asking it a few times in a row: What do you want... and why do you think you want that?
2. Jesus' next reply (v. 39) is an invitation, "Come and see." His answer isn't what we usually mean by an "answer." He invites them to explore, to spend time with him, to enter into a journey of learning him. How have you learned Jesus before? Is Jesus inviting you to any next steps to come and see him more?
3. In this story, some characters invite other characters to "come and see" Jesus based on their own experience. Who has played that role in your life? Do you think you play that role in anyone else's life?
4. The invitation "come and see" implies a promise that Jesus offers something worth finding. At the end of the story, Jesus makes an explicit promise to Nathanael, albeit in colorful Biblical language, "You will see heaven open and angels ascending and descending on the Son of Man." As we start the new year, pray that Jesus will reveal himself to you, and that he will open the eyes of your heart to see what he wants you to see.
