- **Lutheran Social Services (LSS) -Faith Mission: \$5000**
- **Lower Lights Health Care/Jubilee Healthy Food Rx: \$12,000**
Access to affordable, fresh, and nutritional foods is limited in the Franklinton area. These foods can help reduce major risk factors and aid in the treatment of a variety of chronic diseases. This contribution will help support 25+ clients at the Jubilee Healthy Food Rx program.
- **Back-to-School supplies for GHHC, Festa, and HARP: \$12,000**
The distribution of this gift continues what has become an annual support to help provide backpacks and school supplies for children in and around our communities.
- **International Friendships Inc. (IFI) : \$3000**
This one time gift supports an IFI startup ministry at Arizona State University. ASU has the sixth largest international student population in U.S. universities.
- **Lutheran Church of South Sudan (LCSS): \$20,000**
 - **Nursing School furniture: \$4000**
This update will help with the accreditation of the seminary and nursing school.
 - **LCSS Seminary: \$6000**
UALC is funding a total of fourteen seminary students each year. There are a total of 56 students enrolled in the 3-4 year program. These pastors in training are a key figure in the refugee churches, providing coordination of church and social needs of its members.
 - **Trinity Lutheran College facility in Itang: \$10,000**
This satellite campus provides nursing, midwifery, and other majors such as business. Students are currently using rented classrooms, but LCSS is being asked to provide classrooms for them. This funding is part of the \$30,000 total project cost of the classroom building project.
- **Heart to Honduras: \$27,000**
 - **General Fund: \$7000**
 - **Communities of Holistic Impact (CoHI) program: \$14,000**
