Jesus Heals Man Born Blind (John 9:1-7, 18-34)

## QUESTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION AND PERSONAL REFLECTION:

1. Check out what precedes Jesus' healing of the blind man by reading any portion of John 8:12-59. Put yourself in the shoes of the Pharisees after these encounters with Jesus. What conclusions have they already drawn about Jesus before John 9? What emotional state are they in as they enter into this next encounter with Jesus?
2. With all these titles and identities being thrown about in John 8 and 9 (children of Abraham, children of the devil) what words get at the core of who you are?
3. At the end of John 8, Jesus declares "I am" and in John 9:35 he refers to himself as "Son of Man." Describe these claims in more detail. What is their significance in regards to Jesus' identity?
4. Discussing "spiritual blindness" could get a little touchy. We take heed of Jesus' words to the Pharisees in John 9 and his teaching from Matthew 7 to take the plank out of our own eye before trying to help remove the speck from our brother's eye. So with some level of vulnerability with each other and humility before the Lord, what is God opening up your eyes to see? Is there something you've been blind to? Most importantly, do you see Jesus clearly for who he is and who he claims to be?
